- Reserves are required to provide 15 hours of volunteer service a month and attend one monthly meeting (counted toward volunteer hours).

Radio communications, databases, defensive tactics, report writing, officer safety skills and working within a police culture.

## POLICE RESERVE *Regular Duties*

Uniformed reserve officers participate in a number of activities including:

- Volunteering at events in the City of Plymouth and neighboring communities to provide security and traffic direction.
- Assisting patrol officers with transports, bookings and service-related calls.
- Helping with police training as a role player during scenario-based training with the Plymouth SWAT team, patrol division and the Plymouth Police Explorer program.
- Assisting with traffic accidents, crowd control, weather-related emergencies and significant crime scenes.
